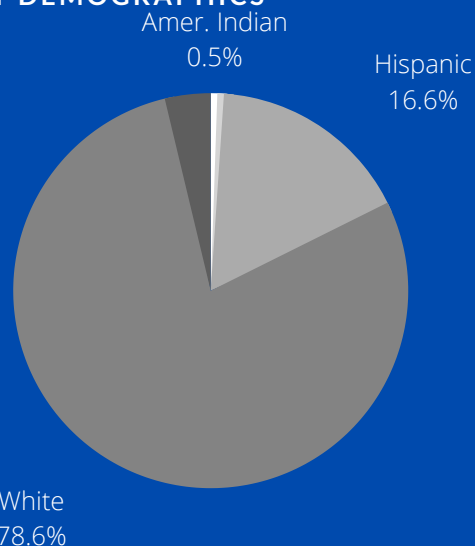




SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Gibraltar High School is a four-year public high school with an enrollment of 191 students. It serves the communities of Gills Rock, Ellison Bay, Sister Bay, Ephraim, Fish Creek, Egg Harbor and Baileys Harbor, all of which reflect a tradition of support for academic, athletic, and cultural achievement. A high percentage of the residents are self-employed business people and many residents are involved in service occupations. Located in Northern Door County, tourism is the main economic base of the communities. Governed by its own Board of Education, the district serves approximately 524 students PK-12.

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



RANK/CUM LAUDE

Grade point average (GPA) is calculated by dividing the sum of GPA points by the accumulated GPA credits*. (*Semester grade point average is calculated by dividing the sum of GPA points by the number of courses taken.) Transfer credits are handled on an individual basis.

Beginning with the class of 2021, the class rank system will be replaced by the cum laude system as defined below: Graduates with these GPAs at the conclusion of their seventh semester will be denoted as honors graduates and will be recognized at graduation:
 Summa Cum Laude: 3.900-4.0
 Magna Cum Laude: 3.700-3.899
 Cum Laude: 3.500-3.699

GRADING SYSTEM

Beginning during the 2019-2020 school year grades will not be weighted. Any weighted grades earned prior to that time will be used to calculate a student's GPA.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

All students must complete 26 credits for graduation as follows: English, four credits; mathematics, three credits (including Algebra 2/Trigonometry or Application of Algebra 2); social sciences, four credits; science, three credits; physical education, two credits; health, one-half credit; technical studies, one credit; fine arts, one credit; and 30 hours of service learning. Students are required to take one-half credit of either a virtual education course and are required to achieve Spanish I Proficiency.

INSTRUCTIONAL HOURS

Classes meet five periods per week for a duration of 43 minutes each. There are two semesters, 18 weeks each. One hundred seventy six student contact days = one (1) credit, eighty eight student contact days = one-half (1/2) credit for each class.

AP COURSEWORK

In the spring of 2021, 40 students took 72 Advanced Placement Exams. The exams given and the percentage of scores of 3 or higher in each area were as follows: Calculus AB 25%, Computer Science A 100%, English Lang/Comp 60%, English Lit/Comp. 40%, Environmental Science 0%, Psychology 57%, Spanish Language 67%, Statistics 100%, United States Government/Politics 50%, U.S. History 64%, World History Modern 80%. For the 2021 tests, Gibraltar had 4 students recognized as an AP Scholar, 2 as an AP Scholar with Honor, and 2 as an AP Scholar with Distinction.

There are 14 AP Courses offered per year in the course handbook, AP Biology and AP Environmental Science are offered on an every-other-year basis.
